

Houghton Medal Awarded to Greatbatches

In 1883, Houghton College founder Willard J. Houghton signed his correspondence, "Yours for fixing up the world," a vision for the college that bears his name and is celebrating its 125th anniversary. To commemorate the occasion, Houghton College President Shirley A. Mullen conferred special honor on a couple whose contributions have markedly advanced the founder's vision. During ceremonies at the college's Wesley Chapel, Dr. Mullen awarded the Houghton



Medal to Wilson and Eleanor Greatbatch of Williamsville, N.Y. Wilson Greatbatch worked with Houghton science faculty in the development of the pacemaker, and Eleanor Greatbatch oversaw the endowment of the Houghton Masters in Music program and construction of the college's newest building, the Center for the Arts, which houses the Greatbatch School of Music. ●
