This talk will review the variety of ecosystems found in Alaska, with a focus on the state’s vast interior. DROP/ADD: A student is *not* dropped from or added to a class until a "change of schedule" form (drop/add) is submitted to Academic Records. ALSO: Any class that is dropped during the first two weeks of classes will be removed from the student's record, *BUT* after the first two weeks, leaving a class is "withdrawing" and will result in a grade of 'W' which will show up on the student's transcript and counts toward attempted hours (keep in mind when calculating your Tuition-Free Mayterm credits).

MAJOR DECLARATION: Students with more than 45 credits accumulated are expected to declare a major. Forms can be found at the Academic Records office.
