STUDENT PAYROLL Information - Planning on working on campus this year? Haven't worked on campus before?

This is what you need to know:

* **All** students must bring **original** forms of ID to campus for employment verification. Most commonly:

- Driver's License or Photo ID **and** Social Security Card or Birth Certificate
- **Or** a Passport works for both forms of ID

* **Direct Deposit is highly encouraged.** Please note that your checks may be deposited into any participating bank account.

There is a \$40.00 fee to stop payment on a lost check.

* **International students** must also provide an I-20 (student visa), an I-94, and visit Kim Cockle in the Student Life Office upon arriving on campus regarding how to apply for a social security number.

* **NOTE: Students are NOT permitted to work on campus without the aforementioned information.**

A student must be **HIRED** by an on-campus department **before** Payroll paperwork can be done. The supervisor must provide a Blue Hire Card to indicate to Payroll that a student has been hired. Then Payroll paperwork must be done before the student can begin working.

-Students may work up to 10-12 hours per week on campus when classes are in session. This is a total of hours from ALL on-campus jobs, not per position; **each student is responsible to for ensuring his/her scheduled hours stay within these limits.**

Celebrate Easter 2020 in the church where Luther posted the 95 Theses! Start planning ahead now to travel to Germany over Easter Break in Spring 2020, and look forward to visiting the important sites from the life of Martin Luther: Eisenach, town of his boyhood and home to the Wartburg Castle, where he translated the New Testament into German while in hiding; Erfurt, the prosperous university town where he studied and then became an Augustinian monk; and Wittenberg, where he became a professor of theology and launched the Reformation by posting the 95 Theses. Prof. Meilaender will teach POLS/HIST 295B: In Luther's Footprints, a 1-credit course consisting of a 1-week trip to Germany. The class can be taken on its own or as a

companion to POLS/HIST 395A: Martin Luther: Politics and the Reformation (3 credits). Tentative cost of trip: \$1975. Contact Prof. Meilaender now to express interest and to get yourself at the top of the waiting list: peter.meilaender@houghton.edu.

REGISTRAR'S OFFICE

All course add/drop activity should be done through the [course add/drop form](#) on the [Registrar's Office website](#). Student Self-Service is no longer available for adding and dropping courses.

Once courses begin, you can add or drop them for a 5 day period. Please remember that in order to be considered full-time, you will need to maintain a course load of at least 12 credits. After 5 days, if you no longer wish to take a course, there will be a time period where you can withdraw and receive a grade of W (note that this will show on your final transcript, and can affect eligibility to participate in student organizations and athletics). Once that time period is over, a withdrawal will result in an F. You can find [specific Fall 2019 dates](#) for full and half semester courses on the [Registrar's Office Website](#).

You will not be officially added/dropped/withdrawn from a course until you complete the ["course add/drop form"](#) or ["course withdrawal form"](#) and receive a confirmation email from the Registrar's Office.
