Cross-listed as POLS and HUM 395, the course meets at 6:30pm on Tuesday evenings and is worth 3 credits. Enrollment is limited to the first 30 students who sign up, so don't delay.*

***Multicultural Teams and Leadership.** It can be taken as INCL 395 or BADM 395. The tentative course description is:*

This course looks at cultural frameworks and other researched concepts that are helpful for understanding how to be part of a multicultural team; and to understand differences and similarities relating to leadership across cultures. Students will engage with concepts from various disciplines that can be applied to diverse work settings both in the States and Internationally. This will include pertinent knowledge about culture, cultural values, and communication differences. Case studies and examples will be used. Students will apply course content to specific work and service contexts of interest.

Need to fulfill your math general education requirement? Take Math Explorations: The Infinite this Mayterm. While we'll be learning about the infinite, the class itself will only last for a finite two weeks. We'll explore paradoxes that infinity creates: for example, if you need to get from chapel to the dining hall, you have to go half the distance between those two places. Then you have to cover half the remaining distance to the dining hall. And then half the remaining distance again. If you always have to go half the remaining distance to your destination, how can you ever get anywhere? We'll learn to see mathematics through new eyes as we discover what it means for something to be truly infinite. In the process, we'll come to appreciate what Georg Cantor, the father of infinity, meant when he said that nature uses infinity to "show more effectively the perfections of its Author." Come explore to infinity...and beyond!
